Jerry Nerman co-founded Arrow Truck Sales in April 1950 as a small used truck lot in downtown Kansas City, Mo. with business partner the late Melvin Spitcaufsky. They started their dealership with a total investment of \$8,000 between the two partners. Arrow since has grown and prospered into 19 retail stores located in the United States and Canada – including the recent opening of two new retail stores in Denver and Minneapolis – and carries a diverse inventory of 2,500 units of all makes and models and offer a variety of value-add services

Jerry has been an active member of the American Truck Historical Society since 1980, and has been involved with the trucking industry for over 60 years. He built a legacy within the industry, developing Arrow Truck Sales into the largest used truck dealer organization in the United States. He did it based upon his philosophy of offering superior value and quality to its customers.”

Other interest includes dedicating a large amount of time to his vast, contemporary art collection and being involved with the Nerman Museum of Contemporary Art on the Johnson County Community College campus in Overland Park, KS.

Jerry was one of the founding members of the Used Truck Association. He and wife Margaret, along with the UTA started the educational fund for young men and women to go to college, now known as the UTA / Jerome Nerman Family Foundation Educational Fund.
